Three responses:

1. Orpah's return to the past
2. Ruth's declaration of faith

Three applications:

1. Honestly assess where your decisions are leading you.
2. Bravely take steps not to let your past dictate your future.
3. Humbly commit your way to God no matter how painful or frightening it may feel right now.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What stood out to you from this past weekend's sermon?
- In the first 5 verses of Ruth we encounter a string of difficulties and tragedies. Can you summarize what happened?
- Can you recount a time in your own life when you felt like everything was going against you?
- What action on the part of God is noted in v. 6?
- As Naomi returns to her homeland with her two daughter-in-laws, what does she urge them to do?
- How does Naomi view her difficulties according to v. 13?
- We see in v. 15 that going back to Moab also meant going back to a previous way of life including worshipping pagan gods. What are ways Christ followers today could get pulled back into old patterns of thinking and living?
- Ruth makes a clear decision to return with Naomi. What does that entail in v. 16?
- In verses 20 and 21 Naomi expresses her feelings about the losses she has endured. She says that she went away full, but God has brought her back empty. Looking back at v. 1, what do we discover about Naomi's perspective? How do we sometimes get fixated on our difficulties and lose sight of God's provisions?
- Looking at your own life, can you see how God has carried you even through some incredibly difficult things? How does that inform your perspective on the future?
