MESSAGE NOTES

And Joshua the son of Nun sent two men secretly from Shittim as spies, saying, "Go, view the land, especially Jericho." And they went and came into the house of a prostitute whose name was Rahab and lodged there. — Joshua 2:1 (ESV)

... was not also Rahab the prostitute justified by works when she received the messengers and sent them out by another way? — James 2:25 (ESV)

By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had given a friendly welcome to the spies. — Hebrews 11:31 (ESV)

Trust God to use your mess as part of His message

... and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins. — Matthew 1:21 (ESV)

But the woman had taken the two men and hidden them. And she said, "True, the men came to me, but I did not know where they were from. And when the gate was about to be closed at dark, the men went out. I do not know where the men went. Pursue them quickly, for you will overtake them." - Joshua 2:4-5 (ESV)

Then she let them down by a rope through the window, for her house was built into the city wall, so that she lived in the wall. — Joshua 2:15 (ESV)

Behold, when we come into the land, you shall tie this scarlet cord in the window through which you let us down, and you shall gather into your house your father and mother, your brothers, and all your father's household. — Joshua 2:18 (ESV)

For we have heard how the Lord dried up the water of the Red Sea before you when you came out of Egypt, and what you did to the two kings of the Amorites who were beyond the Jordan, to Sihon and Og, whom you devoted to destruction. ... for the Lord your God, He is God in the heavens above and on the earth beneath. - Joshua 2:10 - 11 (ESV)

No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and He will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation He will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it. -1 Corinthians 10:13 (ESV)

- Discussion Starter. Share what your favorite thing about Easter is, whether it is something to do with the resurrection story, a family tradition, or a favorite Easter food.

- Read Matthew 1:5. Why is it significant that Rahab, a Canaanite woman, is in the lineage of Christ?
