Genesis 3:6 – 24 (NIV)

Sin separates, sin isolates, sin disintegrates and sin terminates but GOD is making all things new.

- Sin separates (12)
- Sin isolates (5, 9 – 11, & 24)
- Sin disintegrates (17 – 20)
- Sin terminates (19 – 21)

Revelation 21:1 – 6 (NIV)

God is making all things new!

- A new you (2 Corinthians 5:17)
- A new heaven and earth (Revelation 21:1)
- A new order (Revelation 21:4 – 5)

On this mountain the Lord Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine – the best of meats and the finest of wines. - Re-read Revelation 21:1 – 6. What are the reasons that this text brings so much hope?
- Read John 6:46 – 50 & Revelation 21:2. What do these two passages have in common, and why is this so significant?
- How can the promise of new you, new heaven and earth, and new order give us hope?
