## **MESSAGE NOTES**

Everyone who comes to Me and hears My words and does them, I will show you what he is like: he is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. And when a flood arose, the stream broke against that house and could not shake it, because it had been well built. But the one who hears and does not do them is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. When the stream broke against it, immediately it fell, and the ruin of that house was great." - Luke 6:47 - 49 (ESV)

Now a centurion had a servant who was sick and at the point of death, who was highly valued by him. When the centurion heard about Jesus, he sent to Him elders of the Jews, asking Him to come and heal his servant. And when they came to Jesus, they pleaded with Him earnestly, saying, "he is worthy to have you do this for him, for he loves our nation, and he is the one who built us our synagogue."

And Jesus went with them. When He was not far from the house, the centurion sent friends, saying to Him, "Lord, do not trouble yourself, for I am not worthy to have you come under my roof. Therefore I did not presume to come to you. But say the word, and let my servant be healed. For I too am a man set under authority, with soldiers under me: and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes...; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it."

When Jesus heard these things, He marveled at him, and turning to the crowd that followed Him, said, "I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith." And when those who had been sent returned to the house, they found the servant well. - Luke 7:2 - 10 (ESV)

## Growing faith rests in the goodness of God's authority

All these things My hand has made, and so all these things came to be, declares the Lord. But this is the one to whom I will look: he who is humble and contrite in spirit and trembles at my word. — Isaiah 66:2 (ESV)

Growing faith rests in the goodness of God's grace through surrender

And Jesus went with them. When He was not far from the house, the centurion sent friends, saying to Him, "Lord, do not trouble yourself, for I am not worthy to have you come under my roof. — Luke 7:6 (ESV)

God showed how much He loved us by sending His one and only Son into the world so that we might have eternal life through Him. This is real love—not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins. -1 John 4:9-10 (NLT)

- How has God's Word come under attack in our world? What does the Bible mean when we are instructed to "hear" God's Word?
- Share one of your favorite verses or Bible stories that speaks to the goodness of God's character.
