Building friendships through truth

"You know that I have <u>not hesitated</u> to <u>preach</u> anything that would be <u>helpful</u> to you but have <u>taught</u> you <u>publicly</u> and from <u>house to house</u>. I have declared to both Jews and Greeks that they must turn to God in repentance and have faith in our Lord Jesus." — Acts 20:20 - 21 (NIV)

"Even from your own number men will arise and distort the truth in order to draw away disciples after them. So be on your guard! ..." — Acts 20:30 - 31 (NIV)

"And now I commend you to God and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified." — Acts 20:32 (ESV)

"...how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you in public and from house to house, ..." — Acts 20:20 (ESV)

 when you have relationships with truth but there is no grace? And what happens when you have

- Read Acts 20:18 19; 20:31. Why are sharing tears of joy and grief with someone examples of the power of transparency in forming real friendships? How did serving the Lord "with great humility and with tears and in the midst of severe testing" help Paul build an authentic community in Acts?
- C.S. Lewis once said, "The principle of friendship is when two people find that the same thing amazes them." What did he mean by that and how does it relate to following Christ together?
- What step of faith might God be leading you to take in order to build better friendships or help others build better friendships?

- Pray for God to lead you in being a Christ-filled friend to others.
